


HONOUR FOR MURIEL BAMBLETT

It was a fabulous event with such a great turnout! Thanks so much to all who helped bring it together.








We were thrilled to hold our NAIDOC Women's Day Out once again and hugely pleased with the support shown by our women and girls!


Cases of pertussis (whooping cough) are increasing in Victoria, particularly amongst school-aged children.

Cases of pertussis (whooping cough) are increasing in Victoria, particularly amongst school-aged children. Pertussis is a highly contagious respiratory illness known for causing a cough, symptoms of which may be indistinguishable from other respiratory infections, especially in its early stages.

Pertussis can lead to life threatening infections in babies. Adults and older children can also get pertussis and pass it on to infants.

Prompt diagnosis, isolation and treatment can help reduce transmission and protect vulnerable infants. Pertussis vaccination for infants and pregnant women is strongly recommended to reduce the risk of infection and complications.

ZACH AND PETER MAKING A MARK IN COMMUNITY

Building skills and developing confidence in the workplace can be a long journey with many bumps in the road.

But with the support of CVGT Employment, Zach is embarking on what he hopes can be a long and fruitful career serving the community. In 2023 when he chose to connect with our Echuca team, Zach was worried he would never find work. His motivation levels were low and he lacked experience, while his physical and mental disabilities were barriers to employment.

"I didn't know how to do anything or what kind of job I was looking for because I had no pathway before," he says.
"For a long time, I was afraid to try and for a long time I just thought I would be on the dole forever."



To help overcome those fears and start building some workplace experience, our team found Zach a volunteer role. Completing volunteer shifts with Echuca Neighbourhood House, along with some internal workshops at CVGT Employment, saw Zach's confidence begin to grow.

By the end of 2023, Zach was better prepared to try again to find paid employment.

"I met with Zach to chat about what job industries he is interested in," Rhiannon, Echuca Business Development Consultant says.

"I was impressed by how intelligent Zach is. He had a keen interest in administration, and I knew he would be a great applicant for an administration position with Njernda Aboriginal Corporation." With the support of the Echuca team, a job application was made with us here at Njernda. "I try to get in early, I am at my desk a lot, I go to different rooms to take minutes for meetings," Zach says. "I email agendas, minutes and other information that is necessary to be communicated, and I may

do an odd job here or there, including laminating and preparation for events. "It's a good work environment and I work with good people."

Zach is grateful for the support he's received from CVGT Employment via the Disability Employment

Zach is grateful for the support he's received from CVGT Employment via the Disability Employment Services program, and glad he decided to change employment service providers.

CVGT Employment Echuca has helped Zach to pay for his work uniforms and shoes, organise driving lessons and, as he puts it, has provided a safe space to talk about his barriers and goals.

"I would say to people - don't be afraid to try!" Zach says. "Having a supportive provider and someone you can ask for help is important. Go to CVGT Employment, they will get you employed!"



Meanwhile, former West Coast AFL player and Noongar man Peter Matera has stepped into a new role at CVGT Employment to deliver a new Indigenous employment services in northern Victoria's Goulburn Murray Region.

"Peter's appointment marks a significant step in our Reconciliation Action Plan aspiration to build responsive, relevant and trusting relationships with Indigenous participants," Jason Russell, CEO CVGT Employment says.

"I want Indigenous participants to further their careers, to realise the benefits of having a job and financial security," Peter says. "I'm someone who understands the challenges you might be facing and I'm here to have a yarn, get to know you and connect you to community." Based in Echuca, Peter will also provide support to CVGT staff to better service First Nations job seekers.


